#### Note 1: Corporate information

Sotas Inc. (the "Company") was incorporated in the United States of America with limited liability in 2001. The company is a subsidiary of Mantas, Inc (Mantas Inc). Mantas Inc is the subsidiary of Oracle Financial Services Software America, Inc. ("OAI") holding 100% ownership interest in the Company as at March 31, 2019. Effective January 2, 2004, Oracle Financials Services Software Limited acquired all shares in OAI. The Company is principally engaged in the business of providing information technology solutions to the financial services industry worldwide. The Company has a suite of banking products, which caters to the needs of corporate, retail, investment banking, treasury operations and data warehousing.

#### Note 2: Summary of significant accounting policies

#### (a) Basis of presentation

These financial statements comprising of balance sheet, statement of profit and loss and statement of cash flows as at March 31, 2019 have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in India.

#### (b) Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the results of operations during the reporting year end. Although these estimates are based upon management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from these estimates.

#### (c) Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured, regardless of when the payment is being made. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, taking into account contractually defined terms of payment and excluding taxes or duties collected on behalf of the government. The Company has concluded that it is the principal in all of its revenue arrangements since it is the primary obligor in all the revenue arrangements as it has pricing latitude and is also exposed to credit risks.

#### (d) Provisions

Provisions are recognized when the Company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. The expense relating to a provision is presented in the statement of profit and loss net of any reimbursement.

If the effect of the time value of money is material, provisions are discounted using a current pre-tax rate that reflects, when appropriate, the risks specific to the liability. When discounting is used, the increase in the provision due to the passage of time is recognized as a finance cost.

#### (e) Contingent liabilities

The Company does not recognize a contingent liability but discloses its existence in the financial statements.
